



## 2017 Trip Form

The information below is useful in selecting optional trips for your children. Many trips have a maximum enrollment, so please submit your trip sheet as soon as possible. **Trips may be subject to cancellation, or substitution in the event of insufficient registration. The vendors of trips marked with \*\* have asked for a confirmed head count one month prior to the day of the trip. As such, last minute additions may only be allowed if another camper cancels.**

**BE ADVISED THAT THERE MUST BE A 48 HOUR NOTICE GIVEN TO THE CAMP OFFICE OF ANY CHANGES (ADDED OR DROPPED TRIPS) MADE TO THE CAMPER'S TRIP FORM.**

**IN ORDER FOR CAMPERS TO BE ALLOWED TO GO ON TRIPS, THERE MUST BE A COPY OF A HEALTH INSURANCE CARD AND CAMP HEALTH FORM ON FILE.**

<b>Plimouth Plantation &amp; the Mayflower</b>	Start the day with a walking tour of the Plymouth water front. Then go back in time and experience how the early settlers of America lived. Meet the American Indians who helped the settlers survive the first winter and visit the ship that brought them to Massachusetts in 1620. Learn what it was like to live in that time, what was expected of each citizen and what it took to survive.
<b>Heritage Aerial Adventure Park</b>	Ladders, bridges, and zip lines make up the 5 courses of the aerial adventure park. After a 1/2 hour of safety instruction campers will be allowed to spend 2 hours moving at their own pace through the various courses. The courses range from easy (Yellow) to expert (black diamond) and 15 feet to 60 feet off the ground. Located in a black oak forest not far from the camp visitors test their skill and wits as they make their way. This is the camp's ropes course on steroids! This trip is limited to ages 7 and above with some limitations as to course use depending on the age of the camper. For example under 12 year olds may use the three green and yellow courses. 12-14 year olds can also use the blue. Campers must be over the age of 14 to use the black diamond course. Regardless of the age there is plenty of challenge for all!
<b>"Water Wizz"</b>	"Water Wizz" is a water park located in Wareham, MA that is approx. 30 minutes from the camp. It offers a variety of attractions to ensure fun for all ages. The children love a leisurely float in a tube on the running river as well as the thrilling Hurricane Hill. Over 50 ft high Hurricane Hill hosts 3 serpentine slides and 2 speed slides. The new slides opened in 2014 received 2 thumbs up from the campers who tried them out.
<b>A Day in Boston</b>	Join fellow campers as they explore the Back Bay of Boston; take a ride on the historic Swan Boats of Boston Garden and have lunch at Faneuil Hall. If time permits we will fit in a bit of shopping in this renowned location. Actual events may change depending on weather restrictions.
<b>Cape Cod Rail Trail-bike trip</b>	Join fellow campers to explore the back roads, marshes and historic cranberry bogs while biking 16 miles on the well-known Cape Cod Rail Trail. This well used bike path located on the lower Cape travels from Dennis to Wellfleet along the former route of the Old Colony Railway. Stop along the way to enjoy lunch on the beach or ice cream at an old style General Store. The bike path is a paved surface and has few hills. This trip is best of those who can ride a two-wheeled bicycle well.
<b>Nantucket Island</b>	Travel by ferry from Hyannis to the island of Nantucket for a day of exploring the historic location that is Nantucket. On a walking tour, discover the important part the island played in the whaling industry of the 1800's.

**Senior Campers Only:**

<b>Mount Washington, NH 3-day trip (1-day hiking)</b>	Hike the well-known Mount Washington, NH. Campers will travel to New Hampshire and after a night of camping in a local campground will spend the day hiking up the western side of the mountain and experience the majestic views of New Hampshire. This trip is lead by a counselor experienced in hiking in this area. The trip is physically taxing and should be limited to those who are fit and can comfortably climb a large number of stairs (rocks). After another night of camping under the stars the campers will return back to Camp Good News.
<b>Martha's Vineyard- overnight</b>	Continue the exploration of Martha's Vineyard where the day trip left off. Rent bikes and go outside the dockside towns and explore the natural Martha's Vineyard. Visit the lighthouses, the beaches and the well-known cliffs of Gay Head.
<b>Canoe Trip-North River (limited to 16 campers)</b>	Spend two days on the North River exploring the marsh and river. Campers will launch and enjoy a leisurely paddle along the river spending the night at a river side camping spot. The total trip is about 8 miles and will be planned around the prevailing tides for ease of paddling. Campers will all be involved in the set-up of the campsite, cooking, cleaning as well as paddling the canoes.

<b>Day of Shopping</b>	Once in each session International campers will be hosted to a day of shopping at a local shopping mall. Stores there include Abercrombie, Old Navy, Express and many more.
