



2019 Trip Form

The information below is useful in selecting optional trips for your children. Many trips have a maximum enrollment, so please submit your trip sheet as soon as possible. **Trips may be subject to cancellation, or substitution in the event of insufficient registration. The vendors of trips marked with ** have asked for a confirmed head count one month prior to the day of the trip. As such, last minute additions may only be allowed if another camper cancels.**

BE ADVISED THAT THERE MUST BE A 48 HOUR NOTICE GIVEN TO THE CAMP OFFICE OF ANY CHANGES (ADDED OR DROPPED TRIPS) MADE TO THE CAMPER'S TRIP FORM.

IN ORDER FOR CAMPERS TO BE ALLOWED TO GO ON TRIPS, THERE MUST BE A COPY OF A HEALTH INSURANCE CARD AND CAMP HEALTH FORM ON FILE.

A Day in Boston	Join fellow campers as they explore the Back Bay of Boston; take a ride on the historic Swan Boats of Boston Garden and have lunch at Faneuil Hall. If time permits we will fit in a bit of shopping in this renowned location. Actual events may change depending on weather restrictions.
Heritage Aerial Adventure Park	Ladders, bridges, and zip lines make up the 5 courses of the aerial adventure park. After a 1/2 hour of safety instruction campers will be allowed to spend 2 hours moving at their own pace through the various courses. The courses range from easy (Yellow) to expert (black diamond) and 15 feet to 60 feet off the ground. Located in a black oak forest not far from the camp visitors test their skill and whits as they make their way. This is the camp's ropes course on steroids! This trip is limited to ages 7 and above with some limitations as to course use depending on the age of the camper. For example under 12 year olds may use the three green and yellow courses. 12-14 year olds can also use the blue. Campers must be over the age of 14 to use the black diamond course. Regardless of the age there is plenty of challenge for all!
Water Wizz	"Water Wizz" is a water park located in Wareham, MA that is approx. 30 minutes from the camp. It offers of variety of attractions to ensure fun for all ages. The children love a leisurely float in a tube on the running river as well as the thrilling Hurricane Hill. Over 50 ft high Hurricane Hill hosts 3 serpentine slides and 2 speed slides.
Martha's Vineyard	Campers will participate in a day trip leaving from Woods Hole via ferry and arriving in Oak Bluffs. Once on the island campers will see sites such as the cliffs of Gay Head, the Gingerbread Houses, the light house and the oldest working carousel; the "Flying Horses". Maybe if there is time even a stop at the ice cream shop before heading home.
Nantucket Island	Travel by ferry from Hyannis to the island of Nantucket for a day of exploring the historic location that is Nantucket. On a walking tour, discover the important part the island played in the whaling industry of the 1800's. Visit Vestral Street Observatory where the first woman astronomer, Maria Mitchell studied. At the Maria Mitchell Science Center campers discover the smaller inhabitants of the island and can take a walking tour to view the natural beauty of the island

Whale Watch	Whale Watch cruises are generally three and a half to four hours long led by our experienced captains and are narrated by our expert naturalists. The trip begins as the boat navigates through Barnstable Harbor heading out toward Cape Cod Bay. You pass acres of coastal salt marsh and a barrier beach system called Sandy Neck. You will see an historic cottage colony with a 150 year old lighthouse of the same name. Have your cameras ready to spot any one of these whales..... blue whale, fin whale, right whale, humpback, minke, and others.
Senior Campers Only:	
Mount Washington, NH 3-day trip (1-day hiking)	Hike the well-known Mount Washington, NH. Campers will travel to New Hampshire and after a night of camping in a local campground will spend the day hiking up the western side of the mountain and experience the majestic views of New Hampshire. This trip is lead by a counselor experienced in hiking in this area. The trip is physically taxing and should be limited to those who are fit and can comfortably climb a large number of stairs (rocks). After another night of camping under the stars the campers will return back to Camp Good News.
St. Croix, Maine	The St. Croix River flows along the US-Canadian border in eastern Maine. As one of Maine's most outstanding river trips, the St. Croix features a near perfect blend of natural scenery, moderate whitewater and wilderness. The St. Croix, with its quiet tree-shaded backwaters flows through a heavily wooded, steep-sided valley with occasional sandstone and limestone bluffs. We will spend time canoeing on the river and exploring parts of Maine. A stop at the shopping area of Freeport Maine will include LL Bean.
International Campers:	
Day of Shopping	Once in each session International campers will be hosted to a day of shopping at a local shopping mall. Stores there include Abercrombie, Old Navy, Express and many more.

Parental notifications of change/cancellations/additions should be made 48-hour prior to the trip. Cancellations within 24 hours of a trip departure may not have trip fees refunded. Try and review the attached trip descriptions with your child prior to signing them up. **** The vendors of these trips ask us to confirm participant numbers two weeks prior to the day of the trip. As such, last minute additions may only be allowed if another camper cancels. ^^These trips require an additional medical release. See trip description for details.**
